# INTERPOL's Redress Mechanism: Latest Trends, Reforms and Jurisprudence



The panelists will discuss the challenges faced by the Commission for the Control of INTERPOL's Files (CCF), recently proposed and adopted amendments to the CCF Statute and Operating Rules, the launch of the new CCF web-portal for the submission of individual requests, other reforms that INTERPOL has carried out in the past year as well as INTERPOL's engagement with civil society in this regard, the INTERPOL Silver Notice pilot program, the work of INTERPOL's Notices and Diffusions Task Force and its participation in the prevention of abuse of INTERPOL's channels, media coverage of INTERPOL's notices and diffusions, the upcoming elections of the CCF members, the CCF case law, practitioners' perspective on recent trends in the CCF jurisprudence, including countries whose use of INTERPOL's channels appears to be challenged more often than others, criminal charges behind Red Notices and diffusions, and how these trends differ from the previous years.
